To bleed the power steering pump of your Jeep Patriot, you'll need to repeat the following steps until the fluid is air-free: Ensure the power steering fluid reservoir is filled to the proper level. Start the engine. Turn the steering wheel several times, from lock to lock. Stop the engine. Check the fluid level and add fluid if necessary.

When bleeding the system you slowly turn the wheel left to right and don't run it against the lock, if you turn it too fast or too far you will create the fluid (foam). The only way to get rid of the foam is to let it sit overnight or apply a vacuum pump to the system. ATF will foam quicker than regular power steering fluid.

While Mike and I slowly worked the steering wheel back and forth, the fluid level would rise and fall and then we would have to add some more. Finally, the fluid level barely changed as we turned the wheel from stop to stop and it seemed as though we had gotten the bulk of the air out of the system.

Bleeding the power steering pump of a Jeep TJ involves removing air bubbles from the steering system. This can be done by jacking up the front of the Jeep, opening the cap of the pump ...

Air in the system will cause the pump to groan and the fluid level will rise when the engine is turned off. Lots of tiny bubbles in the reservoir is a good sign of trapped air in the system. Repeat the above steps until your power steering is operating normally.

Is there a trick to bleeding air from the power steering? Perhaps a bleeder valve on the steering box? ... still leave the jeep jacked up and the cap off, start the engine (to start pumping fluid) and turn the wheels lock to lock a few more times. That should get all the air out. Check the level again and top off as needed, but don't overfill ...

They also say that the limited amount of time it takes to power bleed the system will have no deleterious

effects on the pump. The pump is known to make a "whoosh" sound as the pressure bypass opens and the pump is known to cavitate, even with the reservoir full, creating oil vapor bubbles that make the characteristic whining sound.

For Bleeding: The first few rounds we started the truck up and let it run just a minute or two, turning the wheel from lock to lock a few times and let it sit. The reason for this is ...

During dealer prep on Gladiators and Wranglers, one of the requirements is to turn the steering wheel lock to lock 25 times (I usually do 30, just in case I miscount one or two cycles.) This is probably to finish bleeding the air from the power steering, and I always do it with the engine running, and check and top off fluid as needed.

I installed the new pump, added power steering fluid, started the jeep and then cycled the steering wheel back and forth about 10 times. Everything seemed fine, until I drove back to the store and the power steering started fading. I let everything cool down and tried it again, I have power for a short time, then it starts to get difficult.

Okay today i flushed my power steering fluid. Mine was the original fluid from 99 it was nasty and has about 112k miles on it. The ps fluid seems to be neglected on most vehicles. ...
