For most recycling centers, simply put your batteries in a plastic bag, which will keep any caustic battery materials from leaking, and leave them at the drop-off point. The facilities that recycle the batteries will sort them properly. For some batteries, you will need to cover the terminals with clear tape to insulate them while still being ...

Once you find a way to recycle your old batteries, take a few minutes to prep your batteries for safe and convenient recycling. **Prepping single-use batteries for recycling:** Place a piece of non-conductive clear tape over the ends to prevent any current transfer. You can also bag each battery individually instead of taping the ends.
