

# Sending lithium ion batteries royal mail

How to pack and ship lithium batteries. Though widely used, lithium ion and lithium polymer batteries are classified as Dangerous Goods by the International Air Transport ...

#1: Yes, you can ship lithium batteries via USPS. However ... There are currently six types of lithium batteries eligible for shipment, in varying domestic or international quantities, via USPS: Don't forget the new lithium battery marks that became mandatory this year!

The answer is yes, Royal Mail permits the sending of batteries but there are a few regulations in place. ... They then scan a barcode to indicate the parcel contains a certain type of product e.g. a lithium ion battery with an electronic device, and it's specified on the postage label.

Note. Effective 1 July 2015, all existing customers and new customers who wish to ship lithium metal batteries without equipment (UN3090) via UPS &#174; Air services must obtain pre-approval from UPS Airlines. This requirement is to ensure that proper training has taken place and that all applicable safety regulations are properly followed for such shipments.

Check the watt-hour rating on a lithium ion battery. ... If you're shipping lithium ion batteries, write "UN3480" if they're individual or "UN3481" if they're shipped with equipment in the Nature and Quantity of Dangerous Goods Box. For lithium metal batteries, use "UN3090" for individuals or "UN3091" if they're shipped ...

Place your device in a plastic bag before packaging it. Make sure you attach the correct shipping label for the service you're using to ship your lithium batteries. You have the responsibility to ensure all your documentation is correct. You must also make sure your package is secure, and will not break if it is dropped.

For more information on lithium batteries please see the IATA Lithium Battery Guidance Document . Sealed lead acid batteries are allowed in the UK, but are also subject to packaging, volume, quantity and labelling restrictions.

For this reason, lithium-ion batteries are considered dangerous goods. Many couriers have these batteries on

their restricted lists. There must be no more than 2 lithium-ion batteries in any parcel. To send Lithium-ion batteries they must remain inside the electrical equipment (such as a laptop) that they are used for.

## **Sending lithium ion batteries royal mail**

Each parcel must contain no more than four cells or two batteries installed in a device. For lithium ion/polymer batteries the Watt-hour rating must not exceed 20Wh per cell or 100Wh per battery. For lithium metal/alloy batteries the lithium content must not be more than 1g per cell or 2g per battery.
