Renewable Energy comes from a source that never runs out. In other words, its source lasts forever. Renewable energy comes from natural sources that Mother Nature continuously replaces on a human timescale. The term contrasts with non-renewable energy, which comes from sources that eventually deplete.

Renewable energy comes from unlimited, naturally replenished resources, such as the sun, tides, and wind. Renewable energy can be used for electricity generation, space and water heating and cooling, and transportation. Non-renewable energy, in contrast, comes from finite sources, such as coal, natural gas, and oil.

For example, fully "renewable" resources are not depleted by human use, whereas "semi-renewable" resources

In a sharing vision of a local renewable energy system, many households will generate their own renewable energy (as in solar photovoltaic or solar thermal systems on their rooftops), but many more, for whom this is not an option, will share in the ownership and operation of off-site renewable energy generation infrastructure such as wind turbines.
